Helping our students stand out in the Admissions process

- written statement, help students find compelling, passionate, and specific ways to communicate their interest in the school and the arts (what is being said, and how it is being said is important)
- Have them connect with the potential applied teacher often and in professional ways
- Encourage students to attend events at the schools for which they are interested
- Help the students provide informative and personalized letters of recommendation
- Assist students in assessing and communicating their extracurricular activities
- For students interested in the arts, help provide audition preparation planning as well as development of professional materials, to include a portfolio
